Football Practice

I have often wondered what would happen if football coaches approached their work like most ministers are expected to. For example, I wonder what would happen if a player was too busy to show up for practice, and the understanding coach simply said, "We'll miss you. I hope you'll be able to make it next week some-



time." Imagine the players leaving practice and hearing the smiling coach say, "Thanks for coming. I hope you'll come back tomorrow."

If a football team operated like a typical ministry, we might expect concerned parents to call the coach, saying, "Can you tell me what's been going on in practice? My son says it's boring, and he doesn't want to come anymore. I was wondering, could you make it a little more fun for them? And by the way, you might want to talk to the coach at the school across town. He seems to have the right idea."

A coach, responding like a typical minister, might first feel guilty that the practices were not meeting the boy's needs, and he would try to adjust his program to suit this boy (and every other boy who complained). Between trying to keep everybody happy and giving every student a good experience, the coach would squeeze in a little football practice. What kind of season would this coach have?

But this is the very way that most churches are expected to run their ministries. To expect that our families be committed to the church at the same level of commitment that would be expected on an athletic team would draw the accusation of legalism.

Real community means real responsibility for each other. It means a commitment to be there for each other even when the schedule is tight and when motivation is low.
